Vocabularies

Spacious / speisos/

Large and with plenty of space.

فضا دار، جادار

My living room is quite spacious, which makes it perfect for family gatherings.

Cozy / kəozi/

Comfortable and warm in a pleasant way.

دنج و راحت

I love my bedroom because it feels so cozy, especially in winter.

Modern / mpd.ən/

Using the newest ideas, design, or technology.

مدرن، امروزی

Their apartment has a very modern kitchen with all the latest appliances.

Minimalist / minimalist/

Simple and without unnecessary decoration.

مینیمالیستی، سادهگرا

I prefer a minimalist style with clean lines and neutral colors.

Well-furnished /wel 'f3:n1[t/

Containing good quality furniture.

مبله و مجهز

The apartment was well-furnished, so we didn't need to buy anything.

Balcony / bælkəni/

A small area joined to the outside wall of a building, usually with a barrier.

بالكن

I often sit on the balcony to enjoy my morning coffee.

Neighborhood / 'neibəhud/

The area around a person's home.

محله، همسابگی

I live in a quiet neighborhood with friendly neighbors.

Detached house /di'tætst haus/

A house that stands alone, not connected to another building. خانه مستقل

My dream home would be a large detached house by the sea.

Penthouse / penthaus/

A luxurious apartment at the top of a building.

بنتهاوس

She lives in a stunning penthouse with a view of the entire city.

Renovate / renoveit/

To repair and improve something, especially a building.

نوسازی کردن

We decided to renovate the old house instead of buying a new one.

Mortgage / mo:gid3/

A loan to buy a house or apartment.

وام مسكن

It took me years to pay off my mortgage.

Landlord / lændlo:d/

A person who rents out a property.

صاحبخانه

My landlord is very kind and always fixes things quickly.

Tenant / tenant/

A person who rents a property from someone else.

مستأجر

As a tenant, I always make sure to keep the apartment clean.

Central heating / sentral 'hi:tɪŋ/

A system that heats an entire building.

سیستم گرمایش مرکزی

Central heating makes the house warm and comfortable in winter.

Double glazing / dabəl ˈgleiziŋ/

Windows with two layers of glass to keep heat in.

شیشه دو جداره

Double glazing helps to save energy and reduce noise.

Backyard / bæk 'ja:d/

An area behind a house, often with grass or plants.

We have a small backyard where we grow vegetables.

Luxury / 'lʌkʃəri/

A state of great comfort and elegance.

Having a private swimming pool is a real luxury for me.

Real estate / riol i steit/

Property consisting of land or buildings.

He made a fortune by investing in real estate.

Homely / həumli/

Simple but comfortable and pleasant.

Although it's not fancy, the cottage feels very homely.

Roof terrace / ru:f teras/

An outdoor area on the top of a building.

My dream home would have a roof terrace with a beautiful sunset view.

Collocations

Fully furnished apartment / foli 'f3:nist ə 'pa:tmənt/

An apartment that already has all the necessary furniture.

I rented a fully furnished apartment so I didn't need to buy anything.

Residential area / rezi den sol eorio/

A part of a city where people live rather than work.

We moved to a quiet residential area away from the city center.

Prime location /praim lou keison/

A very desirable or convenient place.

The hotel is in a prime location, close to shops and restaurants.

Move house /mu:v haus/

To change the place where you live.

We're planning to move house next month to a bigger place.

Pay the rent /pei ðə rent/

To give money regularly for using a property.

If you don't pay the rent on time, you might lose your flat.

Do up a house /du: Ap a haus/

To decorate or repair a house to improve it.

They bought an old house and did it up beautifully.

Take out a mortgage /teik aut ə 'mɔ:gidʒ/

To borrow money from a bank to buy a house.

Most people need to take out a mortgage to buy a home.

Housewarming party / hauswo:min 'pa:ti/

A party to celebrate moving into a new home.

We invited all our friends to our housewarming party.

Dream home /dri:m həʊm/

The ideal home someone wants to have.

My dream home would be a cottage by the lake.

City center apartment / siti 'sentə ə 'pa:tmənt/

An apartment located in the heart of a city.

Living in a city center apartment is convenient but expensive.

Luxury villa /ˈlʌkʃəri ˈvɪlə/

A large, expensive house often with a garden or pool.

They spent their vacation in a luxury villa by the sea.

Shared accommodation /feed a kpma derfan/

A place where people live together and share expenses.

Many students prefer shared accommodation to save money.

Residential building / rezi densəl bildin/

A building where people live, not work.

The new residential building has 20 modern apartments.

Property market /'propeti 'ma:kit/

The buying and selling of houses and land.

The property market has become very competitive lately.

Live on rent/liv on rent/

To live in a house or apartment that you pay rent for.

I've been living on rent for years because houses are too expensive to buy.

Idioms

Home sweet home /həum swi:t həum/

Used to say that your home is a pleasant and comfortable place to be.

خوش به حال خانه ام! خانه خود آدم بهترين جاست

After traveling for weeks, it feels great to be back—home sweet home!

Make yourself at home /meik jo: 'self æt houm/

To relax and behave as if you are in your own house.

راحت باش، مثل خانه خودت رفتار كن

Please come in and make yourself at home.

There's no place like home /ðeəz nəu pleis laik həum/

Nowhere is as comfortable or special as your own home.

هیچ جایی مثل خانه خود آدم نمی شود

After a long business trip, I realized there's no place like home.

Get on the property ladder /get pn ðə 'propəti 'lædə/

To buy your first home as the first step toward owning more property. وار د باز ار خرید خانه شدن

Young people find it hard to get on the property ladder these days.

Bring home the bacon /brin houm do 'beikon/

To earn money to support your family.

نان آور خانواده بودن

My father works hard every day to bring home the bacon.

A roof over one's head /ə ru:f 'əuvə wanz hed/

A place to live or sleep.

سرى بالاى سر داشتن

I don't need much—just a job and a roof over my head.

Hit home /hit houm/

To make someone realize something clearly and deeply.

به دل نشستن، تأثیر گذاشتن

The movie about homelessness really hit home for me.

Feel at home /fi:1 æt həʊm/

To feel comfortable and relaxed.

احساس راحتی کردن

I always feel at home when I visit my grandparents.

Home away from home /houm o'wei from houm/

A place where you feel as comfortable as at your own home.

خانه دوم، جایی صمیمی و آشنا

The hotel was so cozy—it felt like a home away from home.

Go big or go home /gəʊ big ɔː gəʊ həʊm/

To do something with maximum effort or not at all.

یا کامل انجام بدہ یا بیخیال شو

When decorating my house, I decided—go big or go home!

Home is where the heart is /həum iz weə ðə ha:t iz/

Your true home is where the people you love are.

خانه جایی است که دل آدم آنجاست

Even when I travel, I remember that home is where the heart is.

Move heaven and earth /mu:v 'hevən ənd $3:\theta$ /

To do everything possible to achieve something.

از هیچ تلاشی دریغ نکردن

They moved heaven and earth to buy their dream home.

On the house /pn ðə haus/

Provided for free, usually in a restaurant or hotel.

رایگان (از طرف صاحبخانه یا صاحبکار)

Our drinks were on the house because it was our anniversary.

Keep the home fires burning /ki:p ðə həum faiəz 'ba:niŋ/

To keep things running smoothly at home while someone is away.

گرمای خانه را حفظ کردن، مراقب خانه بودن

While her husband was abroad, she kept the home fires burning.

Eat someone out of house and home /i:t 'sʌmwʌn aut əv haus ənd həum/

To eat so much that it costs the host a lot of money.

خیلی زیاد غذا خوردن (به شوخی)

My teenage son eats me out of house and home!
